
#### NEW SECTION

Extensive work has been done on the new part of the grounds being laid out, it is now ready for seeding and rolling. Edward Robinson has done this. He is to be paid for fertilizer supplied there.

Price of burial plots in this area was discussed - Carl suggested \$250 per burial, with an additional \$90 for four corner markers. Moved by Bill Richards that this be policy, seconded by Carl Durant.

Corner markers are to be a MUST for all plots in the new section E and elsewhere when possible to contact plotholders. This will save much confusion as to location. Carl has discussed this with Bowere Memorial and secured prices.

The Memorial Service will be the last Sunday in August as usual. 2:30 Mildred Weir has asked to be excused from duties in this, and Leslie Dulmage agreed to take care of her task - that of assuring Valley Sound System for the service.

Goldie agreed to contact Brian and Sharon Barton and David Downing regarding music for the service.

Some type of cover-up for Claud Cheetham during opening graves in the rain was discussed, but nothing practical was suggested. He will get brackets to hold the planks on the building and a tarp to cover opening Carl Durant will arrange for this.

BUILDING; The small shed at the rear is no longer adequate to house the mowers and other equipment. In the near future, it will be necessary to provide a larger storage area.




