

No doubt, this belonged to the Smades family which also had grants on Concession 1. The name is evidently misspelled.

Over the years, it was owned by Dover Scott and his wife, Cora Alkerton; Lawrence Fretwell and his wife, Elma Perrin, who ran Grenville Dairy from this farm, with a milk route in Prescott; Cecil Bell and his wife Margaret Ralph; and in recent years by Mr. and Mrs. René Nicolier and family who came here from Switzerland. There is a small "hired man's" house on the property, which has had various tenants.

IEAVITT'S HISTORY shows this holding granted to SAMUEL HECK, May 1802. We know that the Heck family occupied the southern 100 acres of this lot, facing on Concession 3.

ANDREW PERRIN, born Hebron, Conn, June 1765 or 66, died Maynard, Mar. 1859. His wife, ABIGAIL GOULD, daughter of Captain Ebenezer Gould, born Killingly, Conn., Sept. 8, 1775, died Maynard, May 7, 1860.

They purchased this land from the Heck flor family sometime before 1807, since the census reveals that their son, Orrin, was born in Upper Canada, Ontario, 1807.

# PERRIN-ALEX + EBIN

The Everts family received a number of grants in this county, and were active in the life of the settlement in the early 1800's. gold to Andrew Perrin, Jec. 24, 1811

DANIEL YOUNG was one of the first settlers in the township, also living on this location. His children spread throughout the area:

Hiram, John, William, Joseph, Polly, Ephriam, Daniel

Sally Margaret and Patty.

Daniel died 1848, aged 77 years, and his wife, Gerutia, 1853, age 77. Both are buried in Maynard Cemetery, the old part.

ALEXANDER PERRIN, son of EBENEZER PERRIN, purchased this farm, and lived there with his wife, MARY LOUISE HILL. Ebenezer lived across the road from this lot, and it was his purpose to secure farms for all his sons. (see account of Lot 14)

EBIN DUNCAN PERRIN, son of Alexander and Mary Louise, was born June 7, 1879, on this farm. Two years later Mrs. Perrin died. Until he remarried, Alex was aided in raising his young son and keeping the house by his unmarried sisters. He married ISABELLE KENNEDY for his 2nd wife, she having come with her parents from Ireland to a holding on Concession 4. Alexander died in 1904, aged 64 yr. of a heart seizure while going about his farm work. His son, Ebin, who was working in Toronto at the time in the office of a wholesale firm, returned to the farm to carry on his father's work. His stepmother lived with him until her death (1848-1919).

EBIN married ELMA ALBERTHA BALL, also of Maynard, in March 1912, daughter of George and Emogene Ball. Their children, who grew up on this farm were:



1942, since Ebin could no longer work the farm, due to infirmity caused by a stroke, the sons not wanting to farm, it was sold to ERWIN FRETWELL. Ebin and Elma moved to a house in Brundage's Corners where they lived for a time, Ebin being employed at Robinson Farms. Later they returned to the Perrin homestead where Ebin died in 1946.







### SUGAR SHANTY

Sugar shanty on the farm, in the pasture near the pond. Each year Ebin, usually assisted by Erwin Fretwell, a neighbour, made maply syrup. The Perrin children always enjoyed being part of this operation. Trees were tapped on the farm and on the adjoining farm of Walter Dulmage who had more trees than he could handle.

Elma made maple sugar which she sold in Prescott, as well as having a supply for the family and friends.

The shanty burned after the farm was purchased by Erwin Fretwell, and the pond is now dry. It was a source of water supply for the cattle on pasture until Ebin built the large water-trough in the lane leading to the stable. This trough was filled from a large tank in the loft of the driveshed, where water was stored after being pumped by windmill from the well in the dooryard. Ebin had water installed in the barn from this arrangement, but it was still necessary to carry water to the house.


