SCHOOL CHILDREN held concerts, collected salvage, pieced quilts, held food sales and purchased Savings Stamps as their effort in the World War II, encouraged and aided by their teachers and parents. Under the leadership of the itinerant music teacher, MISS LYDIA EARLE, several concerts were held when a pageant "Cavalcade of Canada" was presented. Prominent Victory Loan speakers were present at each gathering, and all proceeds from the evenings was given to the Red Cross. These concerts were held at Algonquin United Church Hall, North Augusta Masonci Hall; Domville United Church Hall, and Maitland Parish Hall, with schools nearby coming to participate.

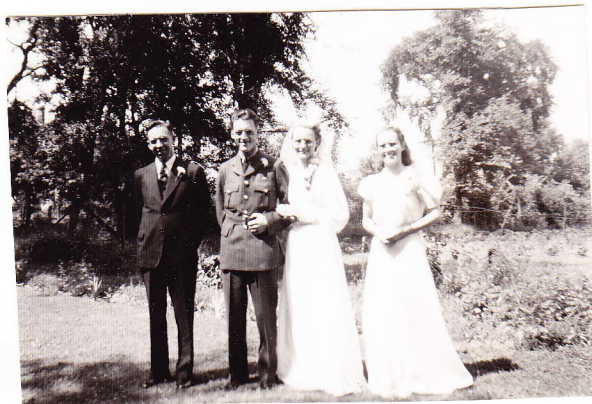
