

To induct new pastor at Maynard on Dec. 30



Rev. Cecil Dukelow

At Victoria United Church, Maynard, on Thursday evening, December 30th, the Rev. Cecil Dukelow will be inducted into the pastorate of the Augusta Charge of the United Church of Canada. The service, conducted by the Rev. Robert Crooks, of Cardinal, chairman of the Dundas-Grenville Presbytery, begins at 8.00 p.m.

For the Reverend Dukelow, it is a home-coming to his home presbytery, as he is a native of

Winchester, where he received his primary and secondary education.

He served with the Canadian Army during World War II as an administrative officer, receiving his discharge in 1946 with the rank of Captain.

After a whirl in the sales fields, he entered the University of British Columbia and followed with theology studies at Union College, being ordained in 1952. His early ministry was the Pacific Coast, including student ministry day in logging communities, and on Vancouver's "Skid Road."

His most recent charge has been Victoria Street-Benmiller Charge at Goderich.

Mr. Dukelow's extra-parochial interests include the Canadian Legion, Canadian Red Cross, Rotary Club, and Board of Trade. Mrs. Dukelow has been on the Presbyterial Executive of the former Woman's Association and WMS, and now the United Church Women.

Their 17-year-old daughter is presently studying at McGill University in Science and Medicine, on a National Scholarship.

The Augusta charge includes Maynard, Domville, and Bethel, and since the resignation of the Rev. John Cook last June, has been under the interim chairmanship of the Rev. D. J. Carnegie, of Prescott.

Rev. D. Gray area cleric dies at 90

Rev. David Gray, a native of Leith, Scotland, and a minister for 38 years of the Presbyterian and United Churches, died here yesterday. He was 90.

He came to Canada in 1906 with his wife, Davina Martin of Dundee, who died a year ago. After taking theological training at Vancouver, Mr. Gray was minister of different churches in Northern British Columbia and the Fraser Valley. He was minister of St. John's United Church, Brockville, in 1934 and later served the United Church at Stirling and Lunenburg, near Cornwall, prior to his retirement in 1955.

Mr. and Mrs. Gray lived retired in Smiths Falls and then came to Ottawa in 1960 to live with a daughter, Miss Phyllis Gray.

At the Congregational meeting on February 25th. the Board of Trustees was requested to invite tenders for the re-finishing of the basement of the Church using a gyprock ceiling and plywood walls. Of the six contractors who were consulted the large majority were not in favour of these materials and recommended acoustic tile ceilings and insulated block walls. Their reason for doing so was that the plywood and gyprock would not be satisfactory because of dampness in a room below ground level. The Trustees specified that prices be given in the tenders for both types of construction. The cost of each method is approximately the same. Therefore, the Trustees recommend to the Congregation:

First - that the construction of block wall, insulated with styrofoam, and an acoustic tile ceiling be approved.

Second - ~~that~~ the lowest tender, which was that of R. & W. Vail, be accepted in the amount of two thousand, eight hundred and ninety-four dollars.

Third - that the amount of money requested by the Trustee Board for the re-finishing of the basement be increased from three thousand to four thousand dollars, in order that the kitchen and washroom may be finished at this time. These items are not included in the above tender. The Congregation are asked to note that the above tender includes a second oil furnace and adequate lighting of the Church grounds. Lights in the basement will be those presently in use.

In closing this report, I would like to thank everyone who helped in any way to prepare the basement for this work, and I would especially like to thank Carl Durant for preparing the specifications to present to the contractors.

It is difficult to assess a year's work in Sunday School because its effect will only be seen in the lives of the children.

We have ten teachers in the school. Mrs Carl Durant and Mrs Frank Conklin teach Nursery Class, replacing Mrs Barclay during the year because of an accident. Mary Shannon is with the Kindergarten Class from which Mrs H. Vail recently retired. Nina Throop, George Robinson and Elizabeth Atkinson teach the Primary Classes. George replaced Barbara Robinson in September when she went to University. Mrs C. Wigle, Mrs P. Conlin and Mrs D. Hammerli are teaching the Junior Classes and Dale Conlin the Intermediate Class.

We have 91 pupils enrolled and an average attendance of 61.

The offerings from the pupils amounted to \$285.90 which, with a donation of \$100.00, brought the total to \$385.90. From this amount, \$241.66 was sent to the Publishing House, \$43.28 was used for the Christmas Party and \$2.80 for miscellaneous expenditures. The total expenditure was \$287.74, leaving a balance of \$98.16.

The total offering to M. & M. was \$122.90, including White Gift offerings, Lent folders and monthly offerings.
