MAYNARD (Special) - A service of welcome was conducted in Victoria United Church, Maynard, Monday evening, Dec. 8, to officially install Claude Delorme, student minister, in the Augusta Pastoral Charge. Despite the adverse weather conditions, a large congregation assembled to hear Rev. Tom Lowry, Williamsburg, deliver the address of the evening.

Chairman for the service was Rev. Wm. Hare, South Mountain-Hallville, and also in the pulpit to assist was Rev. Robt. Knight, Spencerville-Roeback, who has pastoral oversight of Augusta Charge. A combined choir of members from both Maynard and Bethel churches was led by Mrs. Shirley Harrison, organist at Maynard. They gave a rousing rendition of "Love and Praise" as an anthem, and led in the singing of familiar hymns.

An offering for the wider work of the Seaway Valley Presbytery was received by Lyndon Cronk and Gary Mielke and dedicated. Rev. Walter Judge, Chairman of Presbytery, gave greetings from that body and asked the congregation to support Mr. Delorme in his work throughout the charge and in his studies as he prepares for ordination.

The actual service of installation came with exchange of vows by both Mr. Delorme and the congregation. Following his charge to the young pastor, Rev. Hare asked all to extend the right hand of Christian fellowship to him.

Following this service, a social hour was enjoyed in the church parlor, with the women's groups of the two churches providing a bountiful repast.

## Victoria UC receives two memorial gifts

MAYNARD (Special) - Near the close of 1981 Victoria United Church, Maynard, was the recipient of two memorial gifts. The first was an electronic amplifying system which makes possible the sound of church bells announcing the hour of worship and also acts as a public address system inside the sanctuary. This gift was presented by Mrs. Evangaline Carson Andrew, Kingston, in memory of her parents George William Carson, 1877-1953, and his wife, Ethel Robinson Carson, 1876-1976, former members of the congregation at Maynard.

Following the dedication at the morning service Dec. 6, the UCW Afternoon Unit served a luncheon to the members of the Carson and Robinson families who still reside in this area. The assembly was addressed by Mrs. May Carson, Mrs. Andrew and John Robinson who each had fond memories of past events at the church. Reports of the supportive work of the Robinson and Carson families are recorded from the earliest church records to the present day.

The second memorial was a large brass cross which hangs at the front of the sanctuary. It was presented by the Afternoon Unit of the United Church Women in memory of all the dedicated women who have belonged to the various women's organizations of the church for more than a century.

The Ladies' Aid of the former Methodist Church became the Women's Missionary Society and the Women's Association in 1925 at the time of church union, and in 1962 was renamed the Afternoon Unit of the United Church Women.

This Unit was disbanded at the end of December, and, in future, the few remaining members will support the work of the Evening Unit.

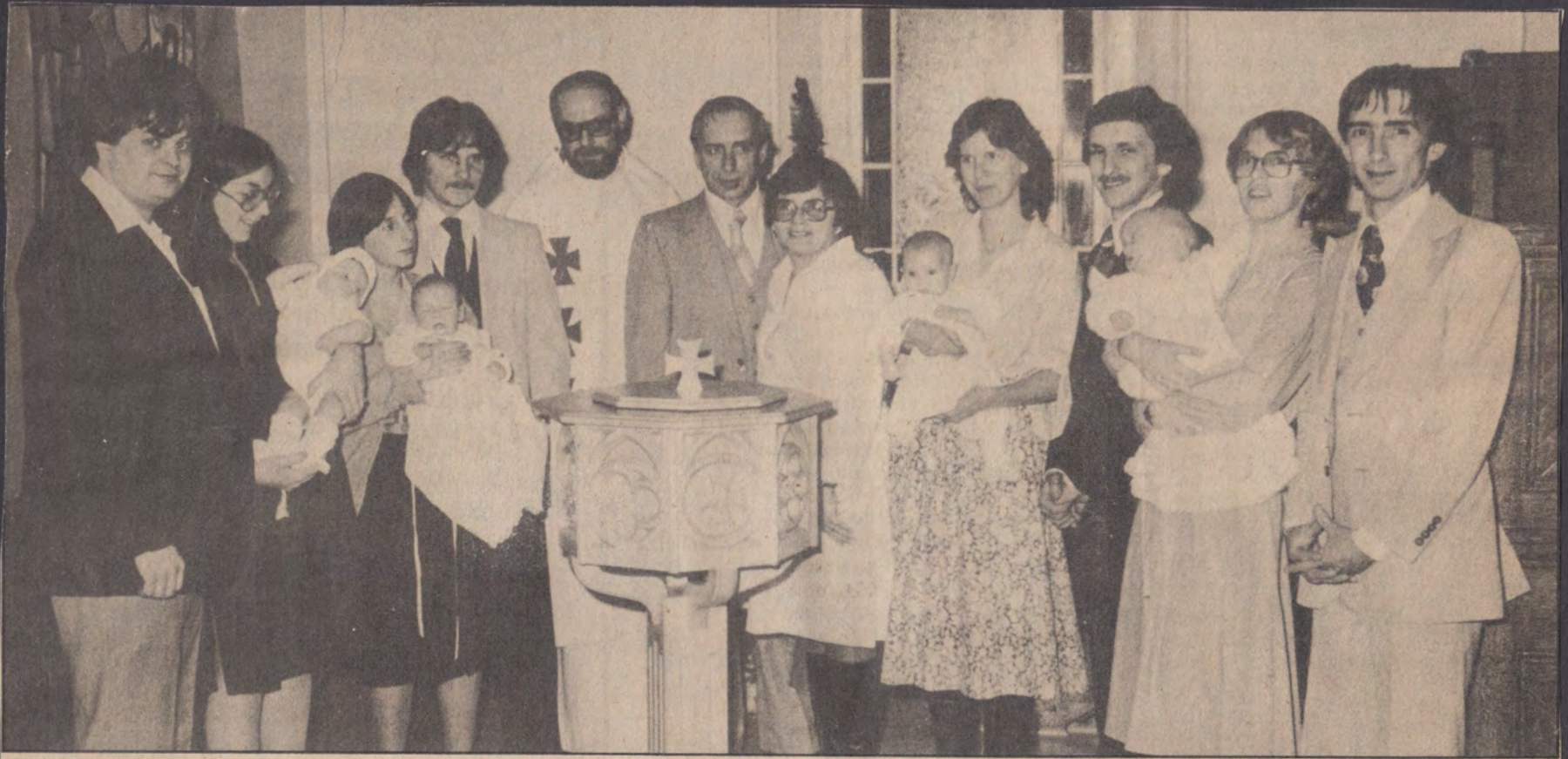

## Memorial Cross

The members of the Afternoon Unit of the United Church Women of Victoria United Church, Maynard, are disbanding as of December 31st. 1981. This decision was made with deep regret. Due to illness and death their numbers have been reduced to a handful with an average age well past the allotted three score and ten years.

The U.C.W. predates its recorded history. At the fiftieth anniversary of the church, held on December 28th. 1909, it was reported in the Brockville Recorder that the church was filled to capacity to commemorate the event, and the people were served an excellent supper in the basement of the church by the ladies. At that time the group was known as the Ladies' Aid, and was a working organization. However, the date of its inauguration is not known. The Women's Missionary Society was formed in 1902 by the minister's wife, Mrs. Conley.

In 1925, at the formation of the United Church of Canada, the organization known as the Ladies' Aid became the Women's Association. The W.A. and W.M.S. met regularly on the afternoon of the second Tuesday of each month. Each organization had its own officers and responsibilities. Collections, which during the depression years, sometimes amounted to less than one dollar, were divided between the two groups. Some fund raising projects were shared and some were conducted separately.

The W.M.S. raised money for the Home and Foreign Missions of the church. The allocation, specified by Presbytery, was always met, often by considerable sacrifice as well as hard work from the members. Bales of food, used clothing and bedding were packed to send abroad and, during the depression years of the thirties, to the western provinces of Canada.

The Women's Association raised money for the upkeep and furnishing of the church and parsonage (Manse). Records, over the years tell of the raising of funds to instal hydro power, new kitchen cupboards and the bathroom in the parsonage. Water and new kitchen cupboards were installed in the church. There are many records of purchase of furniture, appliances, linens, dishes, flatwear, and carpets for both church and parsonage. Money was also raised to pay off the church debt, pay insurance premiums, buy fuel and for the general fund of the church. Both money and voluntary labour were often donated for the cleaning and redecorating of both church and parsonage.

These monies were raised by a long series of projects: church banquets, oyster suppers, catered weddings, harvest dinners, box socials, afternoon teas, amateur plays and variety concerts, quiltings, strawberry socials, bazars, pie socials, bake sales, social evenings, etc. These events served the additional purpose of adding a pleasant part to the social life of the community. From working so closely together the members developed a sense of a church family feeling which provided a source of ready help and comfort in time of trouble.

In 1962 the Women's Association and the Women's Missionary Society became the United Church Women. Shortly thereafter, upon the formation of the Evening Unit, We became known as the Afternoon Unit, U.C.W.

As a memorial to all the dedicated women who have belonged to these organizations over so many years the members of the Afternoon Unit of the United Church Women donate the new brass cross at the front of the church to the Victoria United Church and to the Glory of God.
