Memarial Gross

The members of the Afternoon Unit of the United Church Women of Victoria United Church, Maynard, are disbanding as of December 31st. 1981. This decision was made with deep regret. Due to illness and death their numbers have been reduced to a handful with an average age well past the alloted three score and ten years.

The U.C.W. predates its recorded history. At the fiftieth anniversary of the church, held on December 28th. 1909, it was reported in the Brockville Recorder that the church was filled to capacity to commemorate the event, and the people were served an excellent supper in the basement of the church by the ladies. At that time the group was known as the Ladies' Aid, and was a working organization. However, the date of its inauguration is not known. The Women's Missionary Society was formed in 1902 by the minister's wife. Mrs. Conley.

In 1925, at the formation of the United Church of Canada, the organization known as the Ladies' Aid became the Women's Association. The W.A. and W.M.S. met regularly on the afternoon of the second Tuesday of each month. Each organization had its own officers and responsibilities. Collections, which during the depression years, sometimes amounted to less than one dollar, were divided between the two groups. Some fund raising projects were shared and some

were conducted separately.

The W.M.S. raised money for the Home and Foreign Missions of the church. The allocation, specified by Presbytery, was always met, often by considerable sacrifice as well as hard work from the members. Bales of food, used clothing and bedding were packed to send abroad and, during the depression years of the thirties, to

the western provinces of Canada.

The Women's Association raised money for the upkeep and furnishing of the church and parsonage (Manse). Records, over the years tell of the raising of funds to instal hydro power, new kitchen cupboards and the bathroom in the parsonage. Water and new kitchen cupboards were installed in the church. There are many records of purchase of furniture, appliances, linens, dishes, flatwear, and carpets for both church and parsonage. Money was also raised to pay off the church debt, pay insurance premiums, buy fuel and for the general fund of the church. Both money and voluntary labour were often donated for the cleaning and redocorating of both church and parsonage.

These monies were raised by a long series of projects: church banquets, oyster suppers, catered weddings, harvest dinners, box socials, afternoon teas, amateur plays and variety concerts, quiltings, strawberry socials, bazars, pie socials, bake sales, social evenings, etc. These events served the additional purpose of adding a pleasant part to the social life of the community. From working so closely together the members developed a sense of a church family feeling which provided a source of ready help and comfort

in time of trouble.

In 1962 the Women's Association and the Women's Missionary Society became the United Church Women. Shortly thereafter, upon the formation of the Evening Unit, We became known as the Afternoon Unit, U.C.W.

As a memorial to all the dedicated women who have belonged to these organizations over so many years the members of the Afternoon Unit of the United Church Women donate the new brass cross at the front of the church to the Victoria United Church and to the Glory of God.
