Maynard United Church Women's Missionary Society celebrated its 50th anniversary of Tuesday afternoon, Sept. 9th, in Maynard United Church, with the church being well filled. Invitations been sent to former members for this happy occasion, and guest from Brockville, Ottawa, Prescott, Algonquin and Domville were present.

Mrs. Mansell Hough, president, presided and introduced two former members, Mrs. Russell Dempsey, now living in Brockville, and whose son, Rev. Allison Dempsey was minister at Maynard, and Mrs. Evan Graham (Fresque), Ottawa, whose deceased husband, Rev. Hubert Fresque, was minister at Maynard for seven years. Mrs. Graham was president of the W.M.S. while at Maynard. Mrs. Dempsey and Mrs. Graham had charge of the devotional part of the meeting, and opened the service with the hymn, "Unto the Hills". Mrs. Dempsey read the Scripture Lesson and led in prayer, and Mrs. Graham gave a splendid talk on "Faith", at the conclusion of which the hymn "My Faith Looks up to Thee" was sung.

HISTORICAL

Mrs. Hough gave data when Maynard W.M.S. was organized in March, 1902 when Rev. Conley was minister. Mrs. Conley was the first president, and the first meeting was held at the home of Mrs. Luther Place, now of Prescott.

Mrs. O. L. Carson introduced the guest speaker, Mrs. Worthing of Cardinal, who was listened to with pleasure and profit. One highlight of her address was that "We all leave something behind us as we journey on life's pathway from day to day, and may it be worthwhile. Religion is likened to measles, if we have it, we are sure to show it." Mrs. Worthing compared different personalities to different kinds of candy, the brittle kind, the soft kind, the licorice kind, and asked "Which would we prefer to be?" Mrs. W. Spero and Mrs. Bailey sand a lovely duet.

Mrs. Kenneth McAllister gave a gracious vote of thanks on behalf of Maynard W.M.S to Mrs. Worthing for her fine address, to Mrs. Graham and Mrs. Dempsey for the devotional period, and to Mrs. Spero and Mrs. Bailey for music. Mrs. Percy Fretwell was organist for the benediction.

Dainty refreshments at small tables were served at the close of the meeting in the church parlors which were decorated for the occasion. A lovely birthday cake bearing the inscription "Maynard W.M.S, 50 years", was on display, and was cut by Mrs. Carman Hough.

The Fashion Show had men modelling ladies' gowns. Rev. Payton wore a lovely bridal gown, hsi bridesmaid was Mr. Harley Fortier gowned in blue bridesmaid's attire.

Introduced as a surprise feature was Mr. John Robinson, Mayanrd, showing what the tall, slim girl should wear for lounging.

Rev. McAllsiter reported 1 marriage, 3 baptisms, 5 burials, profession of faith, 2, and transfers 5. Arthur Dulmage thanksd Rev. McAllister for his good services in 1954 and asked him to remain on the Charge. This was seconded by Dr. Sterling Spicer, and accepted with pleasure.

CUP AND SAUCER TEA - August 31st, in the church hall. Sponsored by W.M.S. Quiet music by Mrs. Percy Fretwell set the atmos phere for the serving of afternoon tea at small tables. MRs. PEarl MCLEan, president, extended greetings to all. Mrs. EArl Throop and Mrs. STelring Spicer poured tea at an attractively arranged tea table, with W.M.S. members serving tea to more than 100 guests.

Each guest was invited to take home with her the cup and saucer which she had used. These bone china ucps and saucaers had been purchased at a special price from the T. EAton Company.

Sunday School annual meeting held January 15th, Rev. Mc Allister conducting the election of officers. Report of the year's activities given by Supt. Mrs. Goldie Connell. Y. P. U. disbanded, giving their surplus funds to the Sunday School. This had made possible the purchase of new curtians for the room at the time of the redecoration done by teh W.A.

The picnic at St. Lawrence Park had been successful and fun again, with a special treat of a boat tour through the 1000 Islands for all The Christmas party had been largely attended, with treats for all.
